Course Description

This course is designed to improve and develop student's four English Skills: listening to complex speeches, broadcasts, and technical discussions in the workplace; talking about workplace situations related to personal lifestyles, interests, documents, presentations, meetings, and specific events; reading different news, articles, and reports on a wide range of professional topics; writing work-related documents; and using grammar at B2 CEFR level

Course Objectives

- 1. Summarize main ideas and details of complex, technical texts listened and read in news, articles, and reports of professional topics;
- 2. Apply the vocabularies and expressions to talk about situations related to workplace and specific events appropriately;
- 3. Write work-related documents using correct pattern, vocabulary and grammar at B2 CEFR level.
