

<u>Course Description: Burmese</u> - Elementary Communicative Burmese, with activities to foster reading, writing, listening and speaking using the Burmese language for communication, transferring and exchanging of ideas, using appropriate Burmese language in different situations. This course is for those students who finished Burmese – I and want to improve their Burmese language skills to higher level for transferring and exchanging of ideas in social context.

<u>Course Scope</u>: Burmese - is taught by an instructor over the planned weeks of a semester. Its aim is to improve the student's foreign language skills. The five language skills are integrated during class sessions as part of an environment that fosters creative and communicative learning in classroom.

Course Objectives:

This course aims to enable students to:

- 1. Read and write basic Burmese alphabets, vowels, sentences and number.
- 2. Use common questions and answers in daily Burmese.
- 3. Use the words in daily communications, read short passage and be able to use them to transfer knowledge and opinion.
- 4. Know the word from the daily conversation and basic reading and be able to use them correctly in the own sentences to transfer their knowledge, opinion with the other in Burmese in their daily life.
- 5. Develop the basic reading skill in Burmese Language
- 6. Participate in dialogs typical of real life situations
- 7. Understand the culture of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar
